

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Rocketry Team Qualifies For National Finals

pril 1st, a day that to most is commonly known as a day of pranks, was no such day to St. Andrew's Academy Rocketry Club members. On that day, eight students flew a rocket that qualified them for the national finals of the Team America Rocketry Challenge (TARC).

TARC is a national competition for students in

grades 7 through 12. The goals change from year to year, keeping the competition challenging for returning teams. This year the challenge had three requirements. The rocket had to reach an altitude of 850 ft with a flight time, from launch to touchdown, of 45 seconds, all the while carrying an egg, which had to return unbroken. TARC scores each team by adding points for every foot and second off the desired targets. The lower the score the better. The St. Andrew's qualify last year, but failed.

After much hard work, the team gathered in a Greenville pasture for this year's qualification attempt. As each student carefully did his or her job, they hoped that day would be the day they qualified for the national competition. To make sure everything was as it should be, the team launched a practice flight. It was too high, so the students calculated how much weight to add to the rocket, hoping to nail the next flight. Serena Howe, the project manager, pushed the button and the rocket shot off into the air. Soon after, one of the timers called 40 seconds. A few seconds more and the rocket

landed across the road, with a time of 46.78 seconds.

Joe Salvatore, in charge of manufacturing, rushed across the meadow to retrieve the rocket, impatient to know what height the altimeter read. "Yea!" the excitement carried in his voice and the rest of the team members were filled with anticipation.

"What's the height?" yelled back the others.

"853 feet!"

They had received a score of 4.78, beating their goal of 10. The team members knew they had a great chance of qualifying, even on April Fools' Day. Final confirmation that they were among the top 100 scores came on Friday, April 13, another infamous day.

St. Andrew's Academy Rocketry Club is the only team between Sacramento and Grants Pass, OR, which will participate in the TARC finals May 19th at
